Burundi underwent a major administrative reform in 2023, which was implemented during the 2025 legislative elections. The previous 18 provinces were consolidated into five new provinces: Buhumuza, Bujumbura, Burunga, Butanyerera, and Gitega . Each province is governed by a provincial governor appointed by the central government. This reform also reduced the number of communes from 117 to 42 and increased the number of collines from 2,638 to 3,044 .

Historically, Burundi was divided into 17 or 18 provinces, depending on the source, with each province named after its capital city . These provinces were further divided into communes and collines, forming a hierarchical administrative system. The original provincial divisions were established during Belgian colonial rule in 1960 to replace traditional chieftains and were later adjusted post-independence to align with governance and ethnic considerations .

- **Collines (Hills):** The smallest administrative unit, representing local communities and neighborhoods. Collines are particularly important in rural areas for local governance and resource management .
