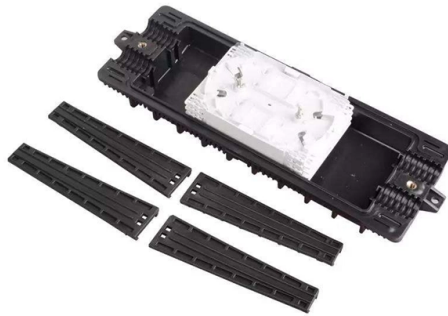

The IEC (International Electrotechnical Commission) and BS 7671 (British Standard for Electrical Installations) both provide essential requirements for electrical installations, including those for fuse boards like garage unit, consumer unit and distribution board. Each local jurisdiction adopts a version of the NEC, sometimes with local amendments, which means homeowners must confirm the specific code. Electrical enclosure ratings tell you what kind of protection an enclosure can provide—but not all ratings measure the same thing.
