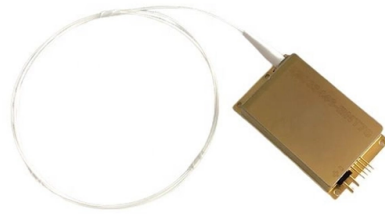


Control wire for distribution box blue wire
