Fiber optic cables transmit data as light signals through thin strands of glass or plastic. These strands are extremely delicate, and even minor physical damage can cause signal loss, attenuation, or complete failure. The cable is typically protected by layers of cladding, buffer coatings, and an outer jacket, which help prevent breakage and environmental damage.

Effects of Drilling

Drilling a hole into a fiber optic cable will likely:

- Sever the optical fibers, causing an immediate loss of signal.
- Introduce micro-cracks in the glass fibers, which can lead to intermittent signal degradation over time.



- Compromise the protective layers, exposing the fibers to moisture, dust, or mechanical stress, which can further degrade performance. Even a small puncture can render the cable unusable unless it is professionally repaired.

Proper Installation Practices

When fiber optic cables need to pass through walls or other structures, installers drill holes in the surrounding material, not the cable itself. For example, in FTTH (Fiber-to-the-Home) installations, a small hole (6–10 mm) is drilled near an entry point, and the fiber is pulled through a conduit or protective sleeve, then sealed with a waterproof gasket to prevent damage and environmental exposure . This ensures the cable remains intact and fully functional.

Repair Options

If a fiber optic cable is accidentally drilled or damaged:

- Splicing can reconnect severed fibers, but it requires specialized equipment and expertise.
- Replacement is often the most reliable solution, especially for long or heavily damaged sections.
