According to the National Electrical Code (NEC), all wire splices and electrical connections must be enclosed within an approved electrical junction box to ensure safety, accessibility, and code compliance. The enclosure protects wires from physical damage, reduces the risk of shock or fire, and allows electricians to inspect or repair wiring later. Key NEC requirements include:

- **Approved Enclosure:** Boxes can be metal or nonmetallic, but they must be listed for the intended use and environment. Metal boxes provide mechanical protection and grounding, while plastic boxes are suitable for corrosion resistance or lightweight installations.
- **Secure Cover:** The box must have a cover that fits properly to prevent accidental contact with live wires and to contain any sparks or heat generated inside.
- **Accessibility:** Junction boxes must remain accessible without removing building structures, allowing inspection and maintenance.

- **Box Fill:** The internal volume must accommodate all conductors, splices, and devices without overcrowding, as overfilled boxes can cause overheating or damage .
- **Environmental Protection:** Outdoor or wet-location boxes must be corrosion-resistant and weatherproof, typically using UL-listed enclosures .

Wire Mesh Considerations

Wire mesh is not required by the NEC as a covering for junction boxes. The code focuses on using approved enclosures with solid covers to protect wiring. Wire mesh may be used in some industrial or temporary installations for ventilation or physical protection, but it does not replace the requirement for a proper box and cover .
