Fiber internet delivers data using light signals through glass strands, offering faster speeds, lower latency, and more reliable connections than traditional copper-based internet. The installation process typically involves:

- **Checking Availability:** Confirm fiber service is available at your location with your ISP.
- **Fiber Drop Installation:** A fiber cable is run from a neighborhood terminal to your home, often terminating at a Network Interface Device (NID) outside the house.
- **ONT Setup:** The Optical Network Terminal (ONT) converts light signals into electrical signals for your network.
- **Router Connection:** The ONT is connected to your primary router via Ethernet, which manages your home network and Wi-Fi coverage.

- **Testing and Optimization:** The technician powers on the system, tests speeds, and ensures signal quality. Proper router placement and firmware updates maximize performance .

Connecting Two Routers

To use two routers with a single fiber connection, follow these steps:

- **Primary Router Setup:** Connect the primary router to the ONT. This router acts as the main gateway, handling DHCP, IP assignment, and firewall security .
 - **Secondary Router Connection:** Connect the second router to a LAN port on the primary router using an Ethernet cable. Configure it in Access Point (AP) mode or Bridge Mode to avoid double NAT issues .
 - **IP Address Configuration:** Assign a static IP to the secondary router within the same subnet as the primary router (e.g., primary router 192.168.1.1, secondary router 192.168.1.2) and disable DHCP on the secondary router to prevent conflicts .
 - **Wi-Fi Optimization:** Set different SSIDs for each router if desired, or use the same SSID for seamless roaming. Ensure both routers operate on compatible frequency bands to reduce interference .
 - **Placement Considerations:** Position the primary router centrally for overall coverage and the secondary router in areas with weak signal to extend Wi-Fi reach .
