Even though fiber delivers high-speed data, an older or low-end router may not handle gigabit speeds efficiently. Routers have processing limits, and if the device cannot manage the high throughput, your internet speed will drop. Modern routers, especially those supporting Wi-Fi 6, are designed to handle multiple devices and high-speed fiber connections simultaneously, reducing bottlenecks .

Wi-Fi and Signal Interference

If you are using a wireless connection, distance from the router, physical obstructions, and interference from other networks can reduce speed. Thick walls, large furniture, or multiple Wi-Fi networks nearby can weaken the signal, causing slower speeds even though the fiber line itself is fast . Wired connections using high-quality Ethernet cables (Cat 6 or higher) can help maintain maximum speed.

Network Congestion

Routers can become overloaded if many devices are connected at once, streaming, gaming, or downloading large files. This can create a bottleneck, slowing down the effective speed for each device . Upgrading to a router with better traffic management or Quality of Service (QoS) features can help.

Cable and Connection Quality

Even with fiber, damaged or low-quality cables between the router and devices can reduce speed. Loose connections, worn-out Ethernet cables, or using older Cat 5 cables instead of Cat 6 or Cat 7 can limit throughput .

Troubleshooting Tips

- Restart your router to clear temporary glitches .
- Check and replace old or damaged cables.
- Upgrade your router if it cannot handle gigabit speeds.
- Use wired connections for devices requiring maximum speed.
- Reduce interference by placing the router centrally and away from obstacles or other electronics .
