Grounding provides a low-impedance path for fault currents to safely dissipate into the earth, protecting both people and equipment from electrical hazards, including surges and lightning strikes . Bonding ensures that all metallic, non-current-carrying components are electrically connected, maintaining the same potential and preventing dangerous voltage differences .

NEC Requirements

- Article 250 of the NEC governs grounding and bonding for residential electrical systems .
- Grounding electrodes (e.g., rods, plates, or building steel) must be connected to the neutral at the service entrance.
- Equipment grounding conductors must run with each feeder and branch circuit, sized according to NEC Table 250.122, and connected to the panel ground bus .

- Bonding jumpers are required across expansion or deflection fittings in conduits to maintain electrical continuity .

- Metal enclosures for panels, pull boxes, and switchgear must have bolted ground connectors and be bonded to incoming and outgoing conduits .

Practical Installation Guidelines

- Panelboards: Connect the ground conductor from the feeder to the panel's ground bus. All metallic enclosures must be bonded to this bus .

- Pull Boxes: Install bolted ground connectors and connect to grounding bushings on all conduits with a copper conductor for boxes containing power feeders .

- Conduits: Use conduit grounding bushings and bond all metal raceways and boxes into a continuous system .

- Equipment Grounding Conductors: Use conductors equal in size to phase conductors for sensitive equipment to reduce impedance and improve fault clearing times .

- Metal Piping and Raised Floors: Bond all metal piping to the service equipment ground bus and connect raised floor systems to building steel with appropriate conductors .

Testing and Safety

- Maximum resistance to earth should not exceed 25 ohms for effective grounding .

- Regular testing ensures the grounding system remains effective and can safely carry fault currents .

- Proper grounding and bonding prevent electrical shock, equipment damage, and voltage instability .
