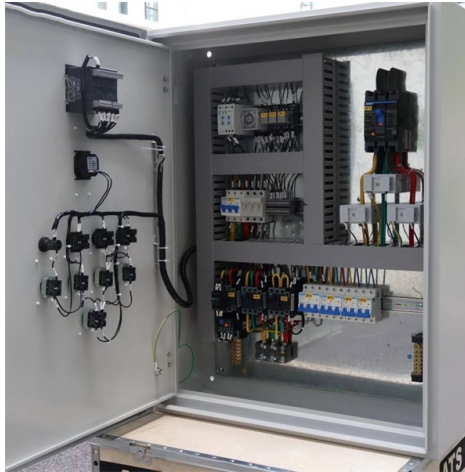


Height of Ground Cable Tray Support
