Future Expansion: Planning for additional cables or upgrades is important. Using a slightly larger conduit than the minimum required ensures that future fiber additions can be accommodated without replacing the conduit .

Practical Recommendation: For a 24-core cable, typical guidance from fiber installation standards and conduit fill calculators suggests using at least a 1.5-inch (38 mm) conduit. If the cable has a thicker jacket or is gel-filled, a 2-inch conduit may be preferable to ensure easy installation and compliance with NEC and BICSI guidelines .
