Boxes made from glass fiber-reinforced polyester, stainless steel, or copper-free aluminum offer better corrosion resistance and durability, especially in harsh or outdoor environments . Regular inspection and maintenance are recommended, particularly in chemical, marine, or high-humidity areas, to prevent premature wear, seal failures, or electrical hazards .

- Ensure the box is plugged into a properly installed and permitted outlet to avoid code violations .
- Avoid using flexible cords as a substitute for permanent wiring; they should only serve as temporary connections .
- Use boxes with built-in safety features such as ground-fault circuit interrupters (GFCI) and overcurrent protection .
- Consider the IP or NEMA rating to match environmental exposure, such as dust, water, or corrosive chemicals .
