Environmental Protection

- Install immediately: Do not leave the sleeve in the junction box without splicing the fibers.
- Use protective measures: Employ installation tents or controlled environments if outdoor conditions are present .
- Secure the cable: Use cable ties, clips, or strain relief components carefully to avoid compressing or deforming the sleeve .
- Inspect before splicing: Ensure the fiber ends are free of cracks, dust, or residue to maintain long-term performance .
