Separation of Cables

Maintain physical separation between power and signal cables to minimize electromagnetic interference (EMI). Typically, power cables are routed above signal or instrumentation cables, and a vertical spacing of at least 300mm is recommended. If space is limited, use metal partitions between trays to prevent interference.

Cable Tray Selection and Installation

Choose trays that match the load and environment: perforated trays for ventilation, solid trays for protection, and corrosion-resistant materials like steel or aluminum for industrial settings . Install trays securely on supports and ensure they are level and aligned to maintain a tidy appearance .

Bundling and Securing Cables

Use cable ties or Velcro straps to bundle cables neatly. Avoid overtightening to prevent insulation damage. Group cables by type or function, and route them in parallel bundles along the tray. Label each bundle clearly for easy identification during maintenance .

Accessibility and Maintenance

Ensure that trays and cables are easily accessible for troubleshooting or future modifications. Avoid overcrowding trays, and leave enough space for airflow to prevent overheating. Consider front-mounting PLCs and key components to simplify access without removing other parts .

Aesthetic and Professional Touch

- Keep bundles parallel and uniform in size.
- Use consistent tie spacing and color-coded ties for different cable types.
- Route cables along edges or corners of the cabinet to maintain a clean visual line.
- Avoid crossing cables unnecessarily; if crossings are unavoidable, do so at right angles to reduce clutter . By following these practices, your PLC cabinet will not only be safe and functional but also visually organized and professional, facilitating easier maintenance and future expansion.
