5. **Splice Plates and Mechanical Fittings:** Splice plates, fish plates, or quick-connect systems are used to join tray sections. They are fixed with nuts and bolts and provide flexibility for future maintenance or expansion .

6. **Covers and Spacers:** To protect cables from dust, chemical spills, or mechanical damage, covers and spacers are used within trays. They also help separate power and data cables to reduce electromagnetic interference .

Best Practices

- Ensure supports are evenly spaced and appropriate for the cable weight.
- Use lock nuts in areas with vibration to prevent loosening.
- Separate power and data cables using spacers or dividers to maintain signal integrity.
- Choose corrosion-resistant finishes like hot-dip galvanized steel in humid or wet environments .
- Plan for future expansion by leaving room for additional trays or modular accessories .

By using these supports and fasteners correctly, cable trays remain secure, organized, and safe, reducing the risk of cable damage, sagging, or electrical hazards in computer rooms.
