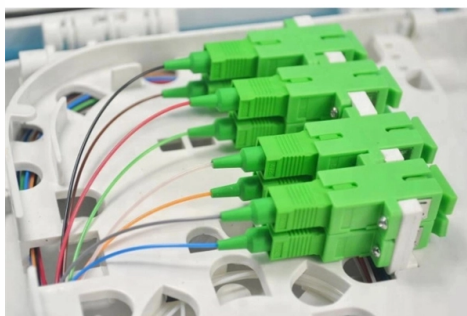


How to mark lines on horizontal cable trays

- **Transfer to Overhead Supports:** If the tray is elevated, use a plumb bob or laser level to project the floor line to the ceiling or soffit where supports will be installed .
- **Check Horizontal Alignment:** Place a spirit level along the line to confirm it is perfectly horizontal. Adjust as necessary before marking support points .
- **Mark Support Locations:** Use a permanent marker to indicate where threaded rods, Unistrut channels, or brackets will be installed. Include hole positions for anchors or fasteners .
- **Verify Measurements:** Double-check distances between supports (typically 1.5-2 meters for horizontal runs) and ensure the line is continuous and level across the entire span .

Tips for Accuracy

- For long runs, a crossline laser ensures consistent horizontal alignment without repeated manual leveling .
- Always measure twice before marking to avoid errors that could affect tray stability.
- Use spray paint or colored markers for better visibility, especially in large installations or multiple tray systems .
- Ensure safety precautions are followed when working at height, including scaffolding and PPE . By following these steps and using the appropriate tools, you can accurately mark horizontal lines for cable trays, ensuring proper alignment, support, and compliance with installation standards.
