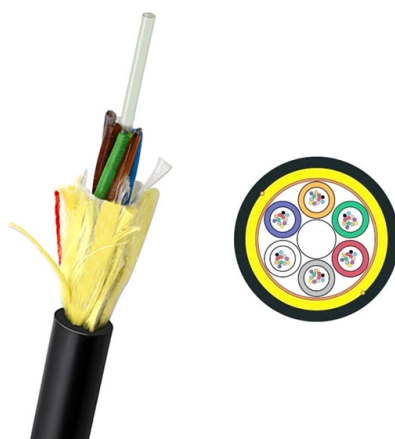


Installation of Outdoor Sheet Metal Distribution Box for Residential Use
