 - Designed to completely eliminate micro transient overvoltages, ensuring long-term stable operation of sensitive equipment

 - Level 2 absorbs residual surge energy and protects most electrical devices.
 - Level 3 provides the final safeguard for sensitive electronics, ensuring no transient overvoltage reaches the equipment .
