

National Standards for Wiring in Display Cabinets



Overview

BS 7671, the 18th edition, is the prevailing standard for electrical installation and wiring safety across domestic, commercial, and industrial properties in the UK. Displays normally less than 36" in height and intended for light weight products. These products typically do not have a hazard of tipping over, loaded to failure, user interaction as limited to store. UL Standards have served as the industry benchmark for commercial displays since 1955. Additional standards and codes of practice would generally be needed to satisfy a specific application - it is the responsibility of the specifier to select and apply these. You should ensure that the standard.
