- **Consult Manufacturer Documentation:** LED meanings can vary by brand, so check your router's manual or support website for specific guidance .
- **Contact Support:** If all else fails, your ISP or router manufacturer can provide assistance, especially if the issue is related to fiber signal negotiation or account configuration .
