These routers are suitable for users who want robust wired networks, enterprise setups, or prefer to manage Wi-Fi separately. Non-Wi-Fi routers can still handle fiber connections if paired with a compatible optical network terminal (ONT) or modem.

Routers Without Fiber or Cable

For locations without fiber or traditional cable, wireless modems and routers can provide internet via cellular networks (4G/5G). Mobile hotspots or LTE/5G routers act as modems and routers in one, offering internet access without physical cables . This is ideal for portable setups, remote areas, or temporary installations.
