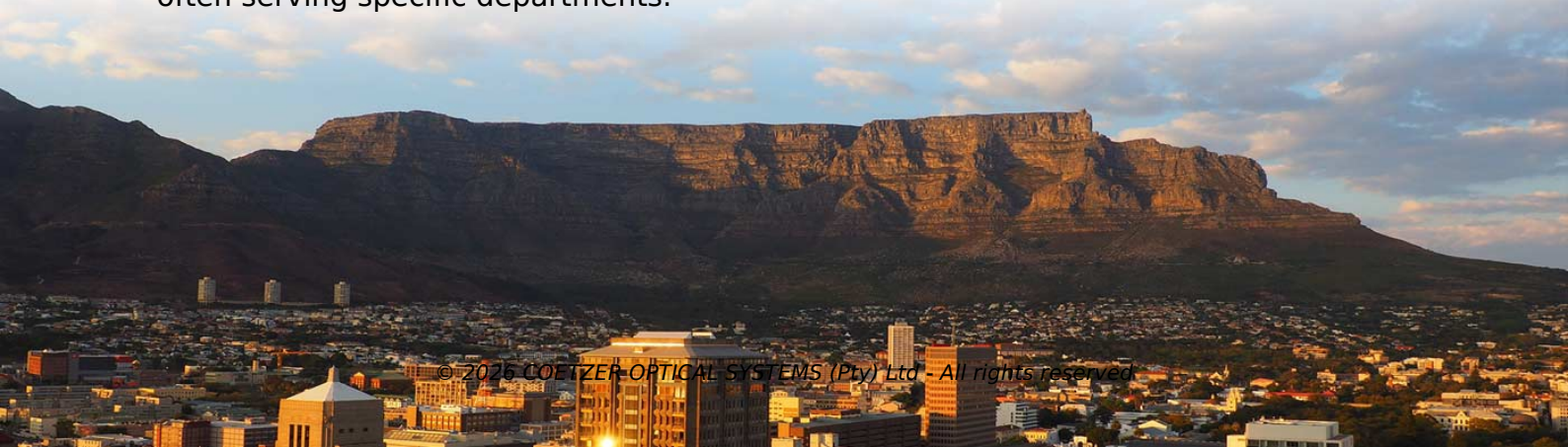

An equipment room houses critical network and IT infrastructure, including core switches, routers, firewalls, UPS systems, and servers.  - Cooling and Power: Core switches generate significant heat and require adequate cooling. Equipment rooms are designed with HVAC systems to maintain optimal temperatures. Ensure sufficient power and UPS support for uninterrupted operation .
 - Cabling Management: Core switches connect to backbone cabling and distribution switches. Positioning them near fiber optic or main cabling trays reduces cable congestion and simplifies maintenance .
 - Accessibility: Although equipment rooms are restricted, switches should be installed to allow easy access for maintenance, line card replacement, and testing without disrupting other equipment .
- #### Practical Notes
- In smaller data centers, core switches may be installed in the middle of a rack if bottom space is unavailable, provided cooling and weight distribution are managed .
 - Ensure that the distance between the core switch and other equipment does not exceed cabling limits (typically 100 meters for backbone connections) to maintain signal integrity .
 - Use patch panels and structured cabling to organize connections between core, distribution, and access layers .
