Primary Core
The primary sector in Suriname contributes about 11.6% of GDP and is centered on natural resource extraction and agriculture . Key activities include:

- Agriculture: Rice, sugarcane, bananas, oranges, coconuts, plantains, cassava, chicken, and eggs .
- Mining and Extractives: Oil and gold dominate exports, accounting for roughly 85% of total exports and 27% of national revenues .
- Forestry and Fisheries: Timber and shrimp are also significant, though smaller in scale . Despite its smaller GDP share, the primary sector is crucial for employment and export earnings, particularly in rural areas.

Secondary Core

The secondary sector contributes about 31.1% of GDP and involves industrial processing and manufacturing . Key components include:



- Processing of raw materials: Gold, oil, and lumber are transformed into marketable products.
 - Food processing: Local agricultural products are processed for domestic consumption and export.
 - Manufacturing: Although limited, it accounted for 7.42% of total exports in 2023, indicating a modest role in driving economic growth . This sector acts as the industrial backbone, converting Suriname's natural resources into value-added goods.
- Tertiary Sector

While not part of the "main and secondary cores," the tertiary sector dominates the economy, contributing 57.4% of GDP . It includes:

- Services: Banking, finance, education, healthcare, communication, transportation, and logistics.
- Tourism: Eco-tourism in areas like the Central Suriname Nature Reserve and Brownsberg Nature Park attracts over 300,000 visitors annually .
- Telecommunications: Mobile cellular subscriptions are high, reflecting a growing digital economy .

Economic Implications

Suriname's reliance on the primary core makes it vulnerable to commodity price fluctuations, while the secondary core provides industrial stability and employment . The government is pursuing sustainable economic diversification, balancing resource extraction with environmental protection and social inclusivity . In summary, Suriname's main core is its extractive and agricultural base, the secondary core is its industrial processing sector, and the tertiary sector supports services and tourism, collectively shaping the country's economic landscape.
