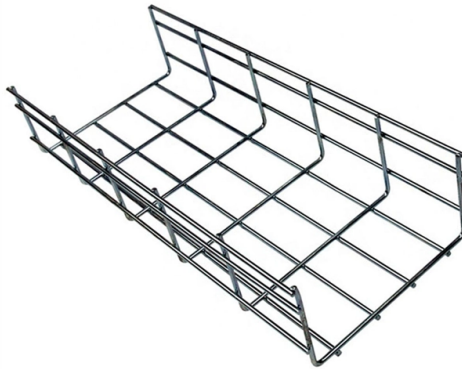

Recommended Solutions

- **Reconfigure the Layout:** If relocation is not feasible, adjust the cabinet or surrounding furniture to create sufficient clearance around the distribution box. A clear working space is necessary for wiring inspection, maintenance, and emergency access .
- **Follow Safety Standards:** Maintain proper ventilation and heat dissipation around the distribution box to prevent overheating. Ensure that all wiring is insulated and that overload protection is in place .
- **Label and Mark Clearly:** Use visible safety signs to indicate the distribution box location and its components, reducing the risk of accidental misuse or obstruction in the future .
