Grounding in a distribution box is essential for safety. It directs stray electricity safely into the ground, reducing the risk of electric shock and protecting equipment from damage. All metal parts of the box, including the enclosure, electrical installation board, and metal components of devices inside, must be grounded to maintain a safe electrical system .

Grounding Wire Specifications

The grounding wire should be made of copper and have a cross-sectional area that meets local standards. For example, in the US, a 10 AWG (5.26 mm²) wire is typically used, while in other markets, a 6 mm² wire is common . The wire is usually yellow-green insulated to provide a clear visual warning and ensure good conductivity .

Connection Method

- Locate the grounding bar or PE bar inside the distribution box, which is marked for grounding connections .

- Connect the power supply ground wire directly to the PE bar, stripping the wire as needed and securing it with a screw to ensure a firm connection .
- Ground electrical components inside the box by connecting them to the PE bar using copper wires, ensuring all equipment operates safely .
- Verify reliability by checking that all connections are tight, clearly marked, and free from looseness for maintenance purposes .

Safety Standards

Grounding must comply with local electrical codes such as the NEC in the United States or IEC standards internationally. Proper grounding ensures that the resistance between system parts is low (typically
