Fiber optic internet transmits data as light pulses through thin glass or plastic fibers. Standard home routers are designed to handle electrical signals, not optical signals. Therefore, the fiber line from your ISP terminates at an ONT, which converts the incoming light signal into a standard Ethernet signal that your router can use .

Required Equipment

- Optical Network Terminal (ONT): Provided by your ISP, this device receives the fiber optic cable and performs optoelectronic conversion .
- Ethernet Cable: Connects the ONT's Ethernet port to your router's WAN port .



- **Fiber-Ready Router:** Most modern routers are compatible, but ensure your router supports the speeds provided by your ISP and has a WAN or fiber port .

Proper Connection Steps

- **Install the ONT:** Place it near the fiber entry point in your home. Remove protective caps from both the fiber cable and ONT port. Align the connector carefully and insert it until it clicks securely .

- **Connect ONT to Router:** Use an Ethernet cable to link the ONT's LAN/Ethernet port to your router's WAN port .

- **Power On Devices:** Turn on the ONT first, wait for the status lights to stabilize, then power on the router.

- **Configure Router Settings:** Access your router's interface via its IP address and configure WAN settings, DHCP, or any ISP-specific requirements .

Tips and Troubleshooting

- Handle fiber connectors carefully; dirt or damage can disrupt the signal .
- Ensure your router firmware is up to date to maintain compatibility with fiber internet .
- If your router has a dedicated SFP or fiber port, some models may allow direct fiber connection, but this is uncommon in standard home routers . By following these steps, your fiber optic internet can be properly converted and routed through your home network, ensuring high-speed and reliable connectivity .
