The green cylinder you see inside a distribution box is usually the transformer itself, consisting of a core and windings. Its primary role is to convert high-voltage electricity from the utility lines into lower voltages suitable for residential or commercial use, such as 120/240 volts for homes or 220/380 volts for other buildings . This process, called electromagnetic induction, ensures that electricity is safe and usable for everyday appliances and devices.

Structure and Components

Inside the distribution box, the transformer is housed in a metal enclosure that protects it from weather, animals, and accidental contact . The green color is chosen to blend with the environment, especially in residential areas, and often includes anti-corrosion and sunscreen coatings . The cylinder contains:

- Transformer core: Provides a magnetic path for voltage conversion.

- Primary and secondary coils: Windings that carry high-voltage input and low-voltage output.
- Insulating oil or material: Some transformers use oil for cooling and insulation.
- Bushings and fuses: For safe electrical connections and protection.

Safety Considerations

Although the box and cylinder are designed to be safe when undisturbed, they contain high-voltage components. It is important to never open or touch the box, and to maintain a safe distance, typically at least 10 feet from the unit . If the box is damaged or open, contact your local utility company immediately.
