In a standard electrical system, the neutral wire serves as the return path for current from appliances and devices back to the power source, typically the utility transformer, completing the circuit during normal operation. The ground wire, in contrast, is a safety conductor that normally carries no current and provides a low-resistance path to earth in case of a fault. The neutral and ground are intentionally bonded only at the main service panel through a bonding jumper, which connects the neutral bus bar to the panel's metal enclosure and the grounding electrode system, such as a ground rod or metal water pipe. This ensures that the neutral is at essentially zero volts relative to the earth, providing a stable reference for the system voltage and allowing fault currents to safely return to the source, tripping breakers if necessary.

Safety Considerations

Grounding the neutral at the main panel is critical for safety:

- It prevents metal enclosures and equipment from becoming energized during a fault, reducing the risk of electric shock .
- It ensures that circuit breakers or fuses operate correctly by providing a low-resistance path for fault currents .
- It establishes a single reference point for the electrical system, avoiding potential differences that could cause hazardous currents in unintended paths .

Subpanel Considerations

In subpanels, the neutral and ground must remain separate. Connecting them downstream of the main panel can create parallel paths for return current, which may energize metal parts, increase shock risk, compromise breaker operation, and reduce the effectiveness of protective devices like GFCIs or AFCIs . Only the main panel or first service disconnect should have the neutral-to-ground bond.

Summary

- Neutral wire: carries current under normal operation, grounded at the main panel.
 - Ground wire: normally carries no current, provides a safety path for fault currents.
 - Bonding location: only at the main panel; subpanels keep neutral and ground separate.
 - Purpose: ensures safety, proper breaker operation, and a stable voltage reference .
- This configuration is standard in North American distribution systems and is essential for both operational reliability and electrical safety.
