Loose Tube Fiber Optic Cables

Armored cables feature a metallic outer casing, such as steel tape or wire, to protect against crushing, rodents, and mechanical damage. They are commonly used in underground or direct-burial installations and provide excellent durability in harsh environments .

Direct-Burial Fiber Optic Cables

Direct-burial cables are designed to be installed straight into trenches without conduit. They typically include a thick polyethylene jacket, steel armor, and water-blocking gel or tape to resist moisture, temperature extremes, and physical damage. These cables are ideal for secure underground installations .

Aerial Fiber Optic Cables

Aerial cables are intended for installation on poles or messenger wires. They are constructed to withstand wind, ice loading, UV exposure, and temperature fluctuations. ADSS (All-Dielectric Self-Supporting) cables are a common type, using aramid yarn for tensile strength without conductive materials, eliminating the need for grounding .
