Before starting, turn off the main power supply to prevent electrical shock. Choose a distribution box suitable for your environment (indoor/outdoor) and load requirements, ensuring it has the correct IP/NEMA rating and is securely mounted at an accessible height, typically around 1.5 meters . Use insulated tools and wear protective equipment during installation.

Cable Handling

- Strip the insulation of each wire to the required length, ensuring the exposed conductor is neither too long nor too short to avoid short circuits or poor contact .
- Identify wires: phase (live), neutral, and ground. Label them if necessary for clarity and future maintenance .

Terminal Connections

- Connect phase wires to phase terminals, neutral wires to neutral terminals, and ground wires to grounding terminals .



- Use a wire stripper or crimping tool to secure wires to terminals, or tighten screws firmly to ensure good conductivity.

- Install circuit breakers and other protective devices in their designated slots, connecting each circuit wire to the corresponding breaker .

Cable Arrangement

- Route cables neatly inside the box, avoiding tangling or contact with sharp edges .

- Use zip ties or cable organizers to secure wires and maintain a clean layout.

- Leave sufficient space for heat dissipation and future maintenance.

- If the box is outdoors, ensure it is waterproof and consider adding a rain cover .
